

Final Activity

Students may work on their own, or with a partner, to collaboratively research and develop an art making activity for the class to execute during our final meeting. Consider using the work or monument that you most connected with as the base for this activity. Activities need to incorporate key ideas and/or imagery from ancient Mesoamerican or Andean civilizations and should work to reinforce relevant aesthetic concerns.

Compose a single page instruction sheet that includes the following:

- Materials list
- Easy-to-follow instructions
- Example of the final project or images for ideas

Upload your instruction sheet to Blackboard by Saturday, May 12. Students will earn up to 50 points on their instruction sheets, and 50 points for creating a project developed by a classmate.

Activity Ideas:

- String images using icons from Teotihuacán
- Colored paper mosaics in the style of the Moche
- Aztec style Feathered headdress
- Coil pots in the style of the Nasca
- Sand art using Nasca line imagery
- Ancient Andean weaving activity
- Metal stamping in the Lambayeque style
- Bead painting in the Mayan style
