

### Presentation Plan

Please read *A Note on Photography and the Simulacral* in preparation of your presentation. The presentation plan may earn up to 15 points.

Contemporary artist, Micol Hebron has organized *1 Image, 1 Minute* events in multiple cities since 2008, in which invited participants discuss a photograph of their choosing for 1 minute. The inspiration for Hebron's event and the *1 Image 1 Minute* column in *X-TRA* magazine was a similar project produced by Belgian director Agnès Varda (and later written about by Rosalind Krauss) for French television in 1983. For our final exam, we will take a spin on the *1 Image 1 Minute* project and discuss any photograph for up to 10 minutes.

Choose a photograph (preferably made after 1970) that is of significance to you and describe it in a short two to five paragraph essay. Discuss the approach you will use during your presentation to analyze this photo and provide a bulleted list of important points you plan to make. Consider what drew you to this image and how it encapsulates what you have learned about the history of photography this semester. Provide the sources of information in CMS Bibliography format that you plan to use to research your photograph.

*Important!* Please include your photo in your essay by copying and pasting, attaching, or including an image link.

Final Presentations will be delivered during our scheduled final exam period, on Thursday, May 16. The presentation may earn up to 35 points. Remember that you must provide a digital copy of the photo you plan to discuss to your instructor by May 1, and your presentation may be no longer than 10 minutes.
